OPTION 1 - Participants may select their free* college class from a list of classes such as:

Skills for College Success	Everything you need to know about succeeding in college
Essential Skills for Algebra	For those who need a Math refresher
Introduction to Personal Computers	The fundamentals of using operating system and productivity software
Introduction to Health Careers	Acquire an overview of Jobs in the medical field; understand how to manage Lakeland's admission, financial aid, and college systems.
Introduction to Engineering	Discover various career options in engineering and engineering technology, and methods used in solving complex engineering problems.
Fundamentals of Interpersonal Communication	Learn the fundamentals in becoming a better communicator and become prepared to cope with everyday problems in face-to-face communication involving family friends, co-workers and fellow students.
Computer Skill Development	This course emphasizes the beginning use of computer fundamentals such as; computer operations, creating a simple document, and basic Internet and e-mail usage.
College Reading	Focuses on the development strategic college reading skills with emphasis on diverse approaches to reading assignments.
